An investment and management plan for Bend:


- Improvements needed to manage growth to 2040

REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS




- Statewide Planning Goal 12: To provide and encourage a safe, convenient and economic transportation system.
- The Transportation Planning Rule (OAR 660-12) implements Goal 12 by requiring cities to have a 20-year plan that:
 - Supports the statewide, regional and local system
 - Promotes choices
 - Provides safe and convenient access and circulation
 - Facilitates the flow of goods and services
 - Provides adequate funding for needed projects
 - Coordinates with the Metropolitan Planning Organization




WORK PLAN PHASES (2018-2020)

Motor Vehicles:


- Congestion hotspots.
- Limited east-west connections
- Maintenance challenges

Transit:

- Limited frequency
- Requires transfers

Safety:

- High crash areas
- Pedestrian & bicyclist crashes are 2x statewide average



Pedestrians:

- Gaps/substandard facilities on major routes
- Need for neighborhood infill/repair


Bicycling:

- Routes to major destinations need better facilities
- Missing gaps

- Deferred street maintenance: \$85 million (as of October 2017)






Preferred transportation investment package for Bend



Metropolitan Transportation Plan Update

Coordinated process with City TSP

Transportation Safety Action Plan

- Grant funding from ODOT to conduct detailed safety analysis and prepare action plan
- Work to begin in October



- Technology plan for signals, communications, public transportation, information, maintenance and construction
- Plan last updated in 2011
- Working with ODOT to secure funding and initiate update in late 2018 or early 2019






US 97 North Corridor (ODOT project)

- Planning completed spring 2013
- 2017 Oregon legislature \$50 million earmark
- Federal grant application
- Analysis underway






US 20 (3rd Street) & Empire Avenue (ODOT project)

- Fully funded: Mervin Samples Rd to Greenwood Ave
 - ✓ Pavement preservation
 - ✓ Sidewalks, curb ramps and pedestrian crossings
 - ✓ New traffic signals at River Mall Drive, Division St, and Greenwood Avenue & signal connections
- Design funding
 - ✓ New traffic signals at Mervin Samples Rd and Empire/SB ramp to US97
 - ✓ Improvements to Empire/3rd intersection and Empire Ave from 3rd St to SB ramp
 - ✓ Construct Mervin Samples Rd from 3rd St to Sherman Rd

US 20/Cooley Road roundabout (ODOT project)

- Design and right-of-way funding
- Construction schedule dependent on private development
- Construction costs to be shared by City, ODOT and developers

Empire Avenue (City project)

- Extend Empire Ave from Purcell Blvd to 27th St/Butler Mkt Rd
- Construct roundabout at Empire/Purcell
- Construct roundabout Empire/27th/Butler Mkt Rd
- Improve Purcell Blvd from Empire to Butler Mkt Rd
- Work began today (Sept 10) on Phase 1 with work to be complete in June 2019
- Timing of future phases to be determined


